

Surendran Rajaratnam works with WorldFish's Research Division to conduct a range of gender studies in Asia and Africa, such as in the Barotse floodplain, Zambia, and with CGIAR's GENNOVATE study exploring gender in aquatic agricultural innovation processes in Bangladesh and the Philippines. He has also worked on a series of case studies in Bangladesh and Indonesia on women's empowerment in aquaculture, a joint project between WorldFish and FAO, resulting in several publications. His current research interest is in the mixed-methods approach to studying

gender in fisheries and aquaculture, conducting research in India, Egypt, Myanmar. Surendran is a member of the Executive Committee of the Gender in Aquaculture and Fisheries Section of the Asian Fisheries Society and the editor of the Section's e-Newsletter, having been involved with GAFS/AFS events since 2014. He obtained his Masters and PhD at Universiti Sains Malaysia.
